THIS WEEK – WAL SADLO

‘The First Information Revolution’

Looking at the Past that Created the Future.



Our guest speaker this week is former Liverpool Rotarian Wal Sadlo who will give us an interesting presentation about the Penrith Museum of Printing, which is a unique ‘working museum’ established in Penrith NSW in 2001. The museum is managed and staffed by volunteers who are primarily printing tradesmen

The purpose of the Penrith Museum of Printing is to collect, conserve, operate and showcase letterpress printing machinery and equipment so as to keep alive the history, knowledge and skills of letterpress printing for present and future generations.

Wal, who is married with one son and daughter and five grandchildren, is a qualified Letterpress Printer. He ran a printing company in Liverpool for over 20 years before switching to selling printing machinery for 21 years.

Sadly, due to a stroke, Wal had to sell their small printing machinery business and also had to resign from Liverpool Rotary after 43 years. Wal held the position of President in 1970-1980 & again in 2005-2006.

Wal now resides in a Retirement Village near Campbelltown after 30 years of living in Bringelly.



In 1921, the first Rotary charter in Australia was established in Melbourne. Soon after, a charter was established in Sydney. To mark the Centenary of Rotary in Australia, the Royal Australian Mint (the Mint) released two commemorative coins. Both coins represent a unique opportunity for Rotarians and for those whose lives have been touched by Rotary to celebrate this incredible milestone.

The release consists of \$1 Uncirculated coin priced at \$25 each and the \$5 Silver Proof coin at \$110 each. The price includes packing, insurance and postage. Due to variable insurance and postage costs the prices shown are for one coin per order. 

NEW EXHIBITION - FACE TO FACE



Alan Baker Art Gallery's newest exhibition features a suite of portrait paintings that capture a timeline of Alan Baker's Archibald Prize entries aligned with the Art Gallery of NSW celebrating 100 years of the Archibald Prize in 2021.

Highlighting Alan Baker's achievements of entering the Archibald Prize 26 times with 35 paintings, the exhibition will feature his first 1936 Archibald Prize entry painted at the age of 22, a self-portrait study painting by Normand Baker for his 1937 winning Archibald Prize entry, and Baker's 1951 portrait of Australian Filmmaker Charles Chauvel (courtesy of the Royal Geographical Society of Queensland).


LAST WEEK – JESSIE HARMAN, RI DIRECTOR 2021-2023
